This summer marks the Mount Pleasant Family Centre Society's (MPFCS) 46th year of serving our community. During this third year of the COVID-19 pandemic, increasing vaccination rates have helped our community return to more frequent in-person activities and the Centre's program offerings have continued to grow in response.

Our Drop-in programs, ABC Time (School Readiness program), various parenting programs (including Nobody's Perfect, Neufeld: Making Sense of Preschoolers and Circle of Security), and the Circles of Care and Connection (CCC) Early Years Refugee Programs have all experienced increased engagement manifesting our vision of "a vibrant, joyful child and family community where families connect, share, learn and grow."

The ability of MPFCS to meaningfully respond to our community's evolving needs would not be feasible without the dedication of our passionate and creative staff, our volunteers, donors, and community partners. It is a great pleasure to work at Mount Pleasant Family Centre Society again and a real honour to be here in my new executive director role. MPFCS has been a part of my life since I moved to Vancouver. My family still remembers going to the centre and enjoying fun activities and field trips when our children were young.

Knowing how important it is to have a friendly, safe and supportive place for families with young children, was one of the reasons why I decided to work in family resource programs. Over the last 20 years, I have held various positions in the field. I facilitated programs such as family drop-ins, Nobody is Perfect and Mother Goose. I also managed family resource programs at a neighbourhood house. For several years, I coordinated city-wide projects including Parent Connector Program and Open Doors to Learning. MPFCS participated and played an important role in those projects. I am really excited about collaborating with other family places and non-profit organizations again, working with our amazing donors, funders and partners and developing new partnerships.

Having lived in different countries, I understand how difficult it is to settle in a new place, especially if you have been forced to leave your home. As a result, I always wanted to help newcomers and refugees. From 2015 until recently I worked with newly-arrived government-assisted refugees (GARs), first as a manager of our Circles of Care and Connection (CCC) program and then as an ISSofBC Resettlement Assistance Program (RAP) manager.

I look forward to working with our Board of Directors and MPFCS staff to ensure that the Family Centre continues running the existing programs, and to explore new programming opportunities that will help and support families with young children.

It has been a real pleasure meeting our participants and hearing how they enjoy coming to MPFCS programs where they can relax, get support when needed, learn new things and connect with other parents and caregivers while their children are playing and meeting new friends.

I hope that our in-person services will not be interrupted again and I look forward to seeing you soon at our Family Centre.

Perhaps what we are proudest of is how the community came out in big numbers to celebrate Mount Pleasant Family Centre Society's 45th Anniversary, August 2021. Robson Park was filled with over 190 community members and we celebrated with amazing activities, many memories, Anniversary tattoos, and Anniversary chocolate.



Dad's Drop-in Programs

After some COVID-19 downtime, our Dads' Drop-In resumed in September 2021 and we welcomed over 250 visits from Dads and their families on Saturday mornings.

HIGHLIGHTS FROM DROP-IN

Despite COVID-19, a Heat Dome, and Flooding, MPFCS staff rallied and continued to offer services for 45 of our regular 50 week fiscal year. What a year of resiliency, dedication, and determination!! Thank you to all!

- 196 NEW families were able to use our services
- 229 families became members of our society
- Due to COVID, MPFCS had limited in-person visits but continued to connect with families using many creative outreach options including Curbside Visits, 1:1 Phone calls, Activity Kits, Busy Bags, and through Facebook and Telus Television.





Drop-in Programs

- We documented over 3700 visits at our Drop-ins whether outdoors, indoors, or a hybrid of both.
- MPFCS playroom VIPs' Maria, Ewa, and Alma produced 175 recordings of "Family Time" for our Facebook page and, they were aired through Telus broadcasting to families throughout British Columbia and Alberta
- Flora and Alma identified an increasing need to support new parents with their babies and increased the number of 'Baby and Me' sessions to twice a week. 'Baby and Me' registered over 600 visits providing ongoing support to many isolated new parents. Guest speakers provided further opportunities and activities to enhance parentchild attachment and child growth and development; these activities included Baby Sign language, Baby Yoga, Storytelling, and Music!


